

Marsh Creek Eagles Division 1 (Jacobs) – 105lbs.

Marsh Creek Eagles – 19 Penn Ridge Greenjackets – 0

The Division 1 Marsh Creek Eagles 105 lb. team was firing on all cylinders last Saturday as they earned their third shut out of the year, a 19-0 victory over the Penn Ridge Greenjackets.

The aggressive play of the Eagles' offensive line - consisting of Brett Allan, Carter Regitz, Noah Hahn, Brandon Peterson, Jackson Hale, and Kevin Smyth - have allowed the Eagles to make a habit of scoring on the first or second offensive play of the game, and they didn't disappoint against the Greenjackets. On the second play Stephen Koons burst through the right side of the line for 66 yards and the first touchdown of the day. QB David Gallagher ran in the extra point to take an early 7-0 Eagles lead.

The Eagles and Greenjackets both fought hard on both sides of the ball with neither team making significant inroads against the other for most of the rest of the first half. Then Stephen Koons intercepted a pass with just a few minutes remaining and the Eagles took over on the Penn Ridge 33 yard line. With fourth down and 8 QB David Gallagher completed a beautiful 20 yard pass to wide receiver Grey Jacobs to make it first down and 10 on the Penn Ridge 11 yard line. Stephen Koons then weaved his way through defenders for another touchdown to make it 13-0, Eagles, at the half.

The Eagles' second offensive possession of the second half began on the Penn Ridge 37 yard line after David Gallagher intercepted a pass. With solid blocking the Eagles were able to move the ball down to the five yard line with hard running by Drew Rafferty, Kyle Hegarty, and Stephen Koons. The Eagles then scored on a smartly called pass to tight end Ryan Betley, which the Greenjackets were definitely not expecting, to make it 19-0, Eagles. This would be the final score of the day.
