

The Marsh Creek Eagles 120-3 team traveled to Lenape Valley to take on the Lenape Valley 120-3 team on Saturday under the lights again. From the Indian's initial possession the Eagle defense showed they came to play. The pass rush of Mark Dyer, Evan Zlogar forced a fumble that Justin Welker recovered.

After the ensuing Eagle drive stalled, the offense realized they needed to step up as well and on the next possession Eagle running backs Sam Weintraub, Carol Burgess, and Zac Weber took turns carrying the ball and moving the chains until Carol Burgess scored the game's first TD. The defense again stopped the Indians and the Eagle's brother passing combo of QB Drew Weber to Zac Weber scorched the Indian secondary for a 50-yard TD pass.

The defense was not done yet – the Indians were again forced into another poor throw that resulted in an interception by linebacker Ben Ryherd and the half ended with the Eagles leading 13 – 0.

The Eagles opened with possession in the second half and running Carol Burgess carried the ball through the Indian secondary like a pony express rider carrying mail en route to a 50-yard TD making the score 19-0. Pressure on the backfield and standout tackling by the Eagles led by Ben Ryherd, Ross Bennett, Brandon Hall, and Kyle Rubino continued to thwart every effort by the Indian offense.

A long clock burning drive in the fourth quarter wore down the Indian defense and they gave up a final TD run to Zac Weber to make the score 25 – 0 Eagles.
